Important Definitions

SEVIS – The Student & Exchange Visitor Information System

Thisis the information database used by the Department of Homeland Security and Department of State to monitor international students and exchange visitors here in the United States.

- *Graduate students enrolled in at least one graduate credit hour are considered full time if they provide confirmation that they are:
- A doctoral student in their final semester of study, who has completed all degree requirements except the dissertation, or
- A student participating in an authorized Curricular Practical Training of 30 or more hours per week.

Students that wish to be considered full time for one of the above tioned reasons must submit a completed Request to be Considered Full-time with Less than Nine Credit Hours form to the Graduate School.

Online/Distance Learning Limits: Students may only take 3 credits one course per semester that is online or distance learning (more can be taken if you have fulfilled the 9 or 12 credit hour requirement for that semester). If it is your last semester and you only need one course, it cannot be electrime.
