### TRAVEL GUIDANCE

The travel signature on your I-20 or DS-2019 remains valid for 1 year from the date of signature, with the exception of students on OPT, for which a signature is valid for only 6 months.<sup>1</sup> The signature must be valid on your return date to the United States. The signature is no longer valid if you have been academically dismissed, expelled, dropped, or suspended, or if your SEVIS record is terminated.

Your passport should be valid at least six months beyond your expected return date to the United States. Your F-1 or J-1 visa must be valid on your return date to the United States.<sup>2</sup> We recommend that you travel with proof of enrollment (or for visiting scholars, a letter from your host supervisor), as well as proof of financial support.

Contact the International Center if you have questions about your specific circumstances: for example, if you are renewing your visa, if you are planning to stay outside the United States more than 5 months, if your I-20 or DS-2019 will expire within 30 days of your expected return to the United States, if you have been arrested or convicted of a crime in the United States, if you have applied for OPT or are currently on OPT, if you are concerned the “travel ban” may affect you, or if you have applied for another visa status or lawful permanent resident status.<sup>3</sup>
